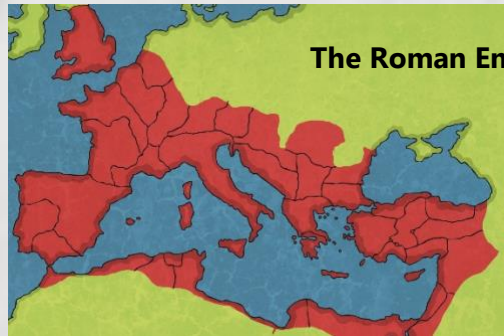




Rotten Romans

First invasion of Britain	55BC	Led by Julius Caesar but failed
Claudius invades Britain	43AD	Claudius leads the first successful invasion
Rebellion against Romans	60AD	Tribes led by Boudicca attack Roman forces
Romans leave Britain	410AD	Romans leave Britain and return to Italy

Emperor Claudius	First Roman emperor to successfully invade Britain.
Julius Caesar	Famous Roman leader who attempted to invade Britain.
Boudicca	Saxon Queen who fought back against the Romans.
Romulus and Remus	Mythical twin brothers and founders of Rome.

Key Vocabulary

Aqueduct	Long stone waterways that delivered fresh water to cities.
Colosseum	A huge oval amphitheatre built in Rome holding approximately 60,000 people to watch gladiator's battle.
Empire	Controlled by Rome, the Empire included most of Europe, the Mediterranean and North Africa.
Hadrian's wall	A defensive wall separating Scotland and England with forts every 5 miles, stretching for 80 miles.
Gladiator	An armed combatant who entertained audiences in violent battles with gladiators, criminals and animals.
Roads	The Romans built the first roads in Britain (over 9000km of them!) and were distinctively straight.
Toga	Romans often wore large, white woollen pieces of fabric carefully draped over the body.
Invasion	One country attacking another to take it over
Legion	One unit of the Roman army; had 4,000 to 6,000 soldiers in. Led by a centurion.
Emperor	The leader of an empire. Similar to a King or Queen.
Senate	The Roman government.
Infantry	The army
Scuta	The name of a Roman shield
BC	Before Christ. Used to show the years before Jesus was born.
AD	Anno Domini. Used to show the years after Jesus was born.
